The dialog box opens when you click the **Add** button  and select **Message Destination Reference** in the context menu.

Use this dialog box to specify the properties of the `<message-destination-ref>` element.

| Item | Property generated in web.xml | Description |
|---|---|---|
| Name | <code><message-destination-ref-name></code> | In this field, specify the name of the logical message destination defined within the Web application. |
| Type | <code><message-destination-type></code> | In this drop-down list, select the expected Java type of the message destination reference. |
|  | | Click this button to open the Choose Class dialog box. |
| Message Destination Usage | <code><message-destination-usage></code> | Use this drop-down list to specify how the Web application will process messages. The available options are: <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Consumes■ ConsumesProduces■ Produces |
| Message Destination Link | <code><message-destination-link></code> | In this field, specify the message destination name. |
| Description | <code><description></code> | In this field, provide a description of the EJB remote reference. |
