View | Tool Windows | EJB

The EJB tool window presents the project structure as a tree where only modules with EJB facets are shown. Below each module node, the corresponding `ejb-jar.xml` deployment descriptor is shown.

Use this tool window to to:

- Find out which modules have EJB facets.

- [Edit the modules with EJB facets](#).
- [Migrate to EJB 3.0](#).

Context menu

Item	Description
ER Diagram	For EJB nodes: use this command to open an ER diagram. (This command is unavailable if there are no entity beans in the selected module.)
Jump to Source (F4)	Select this option: <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ To open the selected file in the editor. (To open a file in the editor, you can, alternatively, double-click the file.)■ To jump to the selected folder in the Project tool window.
New	Select this option to create an EJB . Select the necessary bean type in the submenu. The available options are: <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Stateless Session Bean■ Stateful Session Bean■ Singleton Session Bean■ Message Bean■ BMP Entity Bean■ CMP Entity Bean■ EJB Relationship■ Interceptor
Apply EJB 3.0 Style	Select this option to bring the structure of the beans in the selected module in compliance with the requirements of the EJB 3.0 specification .
