


Find Usages. Class Options

Edit | Find | Find Usages

This section describes the controls for specifying Class Usage Search and Interface Usage Search options in the **Find Usages** dialog box.

Item	Description
Find	<p>In this area, specify the objects to search.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Usages - if this check box is selected, the search is performed for all references of the class by its name.■ Usages of methods - if this check box is selected, the search is performed for all calls of the selected class methods.■ Usages of fields - if this check box is selected, the search is performed for usages of selected class fields.■ Derived classes - if this check box is selected, the search is performed for all classes that extend the selected class. <div style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin-top: 5px;">The check box is available for class usage search only.</div>■ Implementing classes - if this check box is selected, the search is performed for all classes that implement the selected interface. <div style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin-top: 5px;">The check box is available for interface usage search only.</div>■ Derived interfaces - if this check box is selected, the search is performed for all interfaces that extend the selected interface. <div style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin-top: 5px;">The check box is available for interface usage search only.</div>
Options	<p>In this area, configure the search procedure using the following controls:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Search for text occurrences - if this check box is selected, the search is performed in files registered in IntelliJ IDEA.■ Skip results tab with one usage - select this check box to be navigated directly to the found usage without the Find tool window displayed, when only one usage is found.
Scope	<p>In this area, specify the scope of search. Select a pre-defined scope from the drop-down list or click the Browse button  to open the Scopes dialog box, where you can define a custom scope.</p>
Open in new tab	<p>Select this check box to have the results of each search shown in a separate tab of the Find Results window. If the check box is cleared, the search results will overwrite the contents of the current tab.</p>
